Support MOKA during the COVID-19 Outbreak

During this COVID-19 outbreak, we are taking steps to safely support the individuals we serve, and protect the direct care staff that care for them. Our direct care workforce cannot work remotely from home and they care for an extremely vulnerable population. We are working on relocating the employees from closed service lines to support our residential homes.

For the individuals MOKA supports we are following all safety recommendations from the CDC. Our homes remain dedicated to providing quality care along with ensuring the health and safety of the individuals served. Residential services continue to operate with restrictions on non-essential visitors and added health-screening checklists for employees and essential visitors. We are working with families to support connections with their loved ones through things like FaceTime or Skype.
